


The national picture: an army of missing workers

Historically low unemployment

A total of 1.2
 million people
 are unemployed

The lowest it's been since the 1970s




Resulting in high hidden unemployment

More than triples
unemployment numbers
to **4.7 million**



The regional picture: the North West has relatively higher hidden unemployment than the rest of the country


Unemployment and hidden unemployment, June 2022



In total, there are about 450,000 'involuntary inactive' and nearly 600,000 hidden unemployed in the North-West




Across many cities in the North-West, the increases in the past three years have compounded already high levels of inactivity





Two reasons why the North-West has relatively higher hidden unemployment levels

Poor health is more of an issue



The fundamentals of the economy are weaker


38% of people have high-levels qualifications, compared to 40% in the UK and 54% in the South-East

14% of jobs are private-knowledge servicesagainst 19% in the South-East



It is both a supply issue, with more low-skilled workers who are disadvantaged in the labour market


Hidden unemployment and share of low skilled workers
