



### This has created a high knowledge economy in Bristol






### The result is that wages are above the national average












### Growth brings with it costs



### And public transport is smaller + weaker than some of its competitors


### **WECA + North Somerset:**

Effective population in 30 minutes of the city centre by public transport: **362k** 

### **Greater Toulouse**



Effective population in 30m of the city centre by public transport: **522k** 

West of England's challenge is not to get growth, but to manage the costs of it.

 There is demand to live in and around the West of England area. Supply must keep ahead of this to ease the affordability crisis

Location of this housing is important, not just the quantity
