

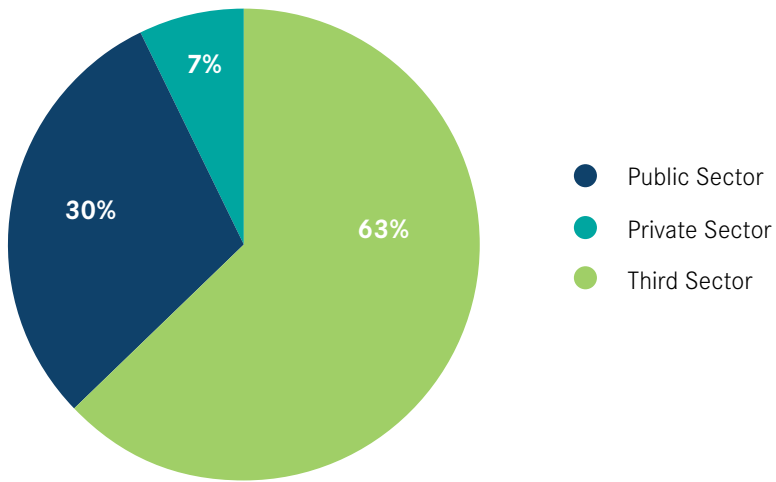
## Who funds Centre for Cities: 2022
